An Extract from Rev Loy's Anzac Day Pastoral Address

Although we may not be sending troops overseas in the numbers that marked many decades of the 20th century, there is still a war that each of us has to face, and that enemy is Fear.

If we don't fight this enemy within ourselves and within our communities we will find that there will be flare ups like those we have seen recently in Christchurch and Sri Lanka. All those flare-ups have their roots in fear. Fear of differences of any kind- whether that be skin colour. cultural background, gender diversity. Religion, or political preferences.

The legacy of the Anzac spirit is to create a country of openness, inclusiveness and opportunity for all. If we allow the enemy of FEAR to overtake us we will miss the opportunity to hand down the Anzac legacy to our children and grandchildren thereby condemning them to lives marked by the suspicion and fear that landed our troops on the

shores of Gallipoli 104 years ago.

The Anzacs fought to build a new world order, so too did those who followed in their footsteps. The greatest way to honour our Anzacs in this 21st century is to recognise that a new world order means naming each person in this global village as my brother, my sister.
